**ORDER**

This criminal copyright infringement matter came before the Court on Friday, January 10, 2020 for a hearing on the government’s motion to continue the trial (Dkt. 141). The government sought a continuance due to the large volume of information it received from Canadian law enforcement pursuant to a Mutual Legal Assistance Treaty request. At the hearing on the government’s motion, defendants Vaillant and Huber opposed the government’s motion. The government’s motion to continue the trial was denied, and the government was restricted from introducing in its case-in-chief evidence that had not already been produced or would not promptly be produced to defendants. The denial of the government’s motion to continue was without prejudice to any party moving for a continuance in the future.

After counsel for the government and defendants conferred, the parties made an oral joint motion to continue the trial. The parties’ joint motion to continue was granted, and the trial was rescheduled for July 14, 2020. The government was directed to submit a Proposed Order that sets out the basis for the exclusion of time from the time limits established by the Speedy Trial Act.

Accordingly, for good cause,


It is hereby **ORDERED** that the joint motion of the United States and the defendants to continue the trial is **GRANTED**.

It is further **ORDERED** that the current trial date of Tuesday, February 3, 2020 is **VACATED** and that the trial in this matter is **SCHEDULED** for Tuesday, July 14, 2020.

It is further **ORDERED** that the government is **DIRECTED** to submit a Proposed Order that sets out the basis for the exclusion of time from the time limits established by the Speedy Trial Act.

The Clerk is directed to send a copy of this Order to all counsel of record and the Pretrial Services Office.
